Embracing the Vision: Giving, Serving, Growing Weekly Stewardship Thought

Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful.

1 Corinthians 13:4-5

Love is inherent in stewardship. The hallmark of stewardship is giving – giving one's time, talent and treasure in service to God through a spirit of love. A steward does not give to bring attention to himself or worry about whether her gift is good enough. Stewards feel the call to give of themselves through their good works and charitable gifts as an expression of their love of God and of humanity.

Mark 2:13-17 13 He went out again beside the sea, and all the crowd was coming to him, and he was teaching them. 14 And as he passed by, he saw Levi the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him. 15 And as he reclined at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners were reclining with Jesus and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. 16 And the scribes of the Pharisees, when they saw that he was eating with sinners and tax collectors, said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?" 17 And when Jesus heard it, he said to them, **"Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."**

I. **Jesus enlists sinners to save other sinners**

II. **There is no one too sinful for Jesus to save**

III. **Jesus teaches us how to be distinct but not isolated**

"The example of Jesus is again our model. He was sustained by his prayers to the Father, and in his fellowship with his disciples (despite their inadequacy). From these, and his deep knowledge of the Scriptures, he drew sustenance to go into the most unlikely company and not only survive in it but actually win others to faith within it. We are called neither recklessly to risk ourselves nor timidly to secure ourselves, but to find the point of life-giving tension between the two. In that way our worship and fellowship have more point and our witness more depth." - Donald English
