James 5:19-20

James 5:19-20 My brothers, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and someone brings him back, [20] let him know that whoever brings back a sinner from his wandering will save his soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

*Our Church Family is called to bring back wanderers.*

- **We are prone to wander from the truth, especially when trying to "go it alone"**
- **We must understand the serious condition of the wanderer**
- **We are called to go after those who have wandered from the truth**
  - **Preventative measures**
  - **Prayerful, humble approach**
  - **Personal, gentle touch**
  - **By the authority of the Church, if necessary**
