APPLICATION QUESTIONS

1. In what ways has the cross impacted your testimony to those that are around you?
2. How do you characterize Christ's crucifixion to unbelievers?
3. Mark's account of the crucifixion depicts the two sides of this world: the light – those with Christ, and the dark – those who are blind to see who Christ really is. In what ways does the Cross help you live a culture filled with darkness?
4. How has the Cross changed your life? Do you put yourself in situations to be ready to serve Christ, in the manner that Simon the Cyrene did?

The King is Crucified

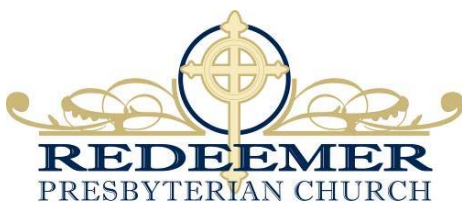
Mark 15:16-32

Mark 15:16 And the soldiers led him away inside the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters), and they called together the whole battalion. [17] And they clothed him in a purple cloak, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on him. [18] And they began to salute him, "Hail, King of the Jews!" [19] And they were striking his head with a reed and spitting on him and kneeling down in homage to him. [20] And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. And they led him out to crucify him. [21] And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross. [22] And they brought him to the place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull). [23] And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. [24] And they crucified him and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. [25] And it was the third hour when they crucified him. [26] And the inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews." [27] And with him they crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. [29] And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying, "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, [30] save yourself, and come down from the cross!" [31] So also the chief priests with the scribes mocked him to one another, saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. [32] Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also reviled him.

"Man's problem is alienation from God. Sacrifice is essential to solving that problem. But few could anticipate a sacrifice like this! Few men understood that the sacrifice that must be given to God, God himself would have to provide." - Robert Rayburn
